Maine’s 131st Legislature Update:

LD 1749: PT Licensure Compact

- Reid commented that a public hearing is taking place today 5/4
- Danielle added that the bill will create licensure compact for PT and require background checks

LD 940: Telepharmacy

- Carol shared that this bill was submitted to help address long-standing access to pharmacy services in Washington and Hancock counties
- Pharmacy Board has some regulations but looked into expanding; Bill identified as ought not to pass because pharmacy board can approve without legislation.

LD 361: Increase MaineCare Reimbursement for Electronic Consultations

- Danielle added to the agenda and shared in chat: <https://legislature.maine.gov/bills/getPDF.asp?paper=SP0168&item=1&snum=131>
- Mainecare submitted testimony opposing bill; Henry commented Mainecare is installing process for rate studies and rate setting. Increasing a rate for a single service would upset the point to create an overarching rate setting schedule based on methodology.
- Danielle commented that eConsults are not being covered consistently among private payers, although Maine’s private payer law requires coverages of asynchronous telehealth.

LD 1249

- Bill would prohibiting physicians from prescribing abortion-inducing drugs or devices through telehealth or other electronic communication
